One boy and three girls were selected to join Secondary school at Ganako while two girls and three was proceeding to form three of secondary school. At Manyara VTC Collage, two more children (James Zacharia and Johnson Zacharia) were given chances to pursue their dreams in Carpentry and Welding respectively. Now at collage there are 8 children in total who pursue their dreams and develop their talents. These children are doing different courses, some 2 years and some 3 years both in electrical Installation, Carpentry and Joinery, Welding, Plumbing, Wildlife management,

Mwema Day

Mwema Day program has been changing and transforming lives of most vulnerable children in Karatu through its life lessons program. Mwema team managed to conduct five Mwema day sessions for this quarter where children participate in the following;



- Children were invited to participate in Mwema day which is held twice a month making 6 times in a quarter. Children from Karatu Streets participated.
- In this Mwema days, children had opportunity to learn about their essential rights and many more.

Sumawe Farm - Tomatoes, Avocadoes and other Vergie's



The tomatoes planted at Mwema farm have yielded and provided a lot of support to Mwema children such as financing some of the activities its activities that are touching children lives. Empowerment and Capacity Building: All of Mwema sustainable projects focus on empowering beneficiaries by building their skills and capacities. For street and vulnerable children, this approach leads to improved self-sufficiency and better long-term prospects, breaking the cycle of poverty and marginalization.





 Children learnt about the good way of getting things they need like basic things while on the street or at home.

An average of 68 children participated in each Mwema day where 33 were children from the centre and 35 from the street. For those who came from streets, 15 were girls and 20 boys an average on each Mwema day session held.

 All children that were invited from streets got time to participate in all events done and had time to eat, shower, wash their clothes and participate in sports and games at Endoro pitch.

Fish Pond & Poultry Farm-Sumawe

The Fish Pond and Poultry Farm project aims to provide sustainable food sources and economic opportunities for Mwema Children and the local community. The project involves the construction of fish ponds and poultry farm facilities in the designated area of Sumawe.



An average of 47 locals, male and female have been temporarily employed by the project and have been able to support their families by the money they earn by working on the fish pond project, especially through pond digging and removing the soil from the pond. Once the digging is completed hopefully by mid-April and the excess soil is appropriately managed, the construction phase for the fish pond will commence, followed by the construction of the poultry farm facilities. Ultimately, the project will provide lasting benefits to the community by offering sustainable food sources and economic opportunities as planned.

Godlive John - To University

Godlive John is going to be the first Mwema child - girl supported to reach at university level. A degree level of course. On she participated in her form six graduation waiting for final examination before she goes to university in October - September 2023. On the graduation, Godlive was recognized as one of the best students in her study combination.

National examination council of Tanzania released advanced certificate of secondary education examination timetable and expected to start on Tuesday 2nd to 22nd Monday of May 2023. This is an opportunity of Godlive John to excel and elevate to another level of her studies.



Godlive is doing History, Kiswahili and English language (HKL). In HKL she emerged number one with outstand performance.

Mobile School

Aiming at improving street chldren self esteem and encouraging them to aspire to go back to school, this quarter Mwema conducted 18 Mobile school session reaching an approximallety 217 children children both boys and girls at seven different locations.



Other topics included, Mathematics (Basic for Children, Playing Mobile School Games etc. Our street workers had time for children counselling and asking those wo wanted to join school to come to Mwema. Five boys children have been registred to COBET as a results of Mobile school activities this quarter.





International Women's Day

International Women's Day is a global holiday celebrated annually on March 8 as a focal point in the women's rights movement, bringing attention to issues such as gender equality, reproductive rights, and violence and abuse against women. This year Mwema joined all women in the world in celebrating the day with a theme: The Accelerate Equality initiative aims to close gender gaps and promote women and girls' empowerment to drive transformative change, unlocking trillions of dollars in economic potential.



On the day Mwema invited some influential women from Karatu to come and speak with Mwema children and staff. Among many topics discussed and presented, girls - children were encouraged to pursue their dreams and that, they can be whatever they want o be in life be it a lawyer, pilot or a president.



The aim of the IWD 2023 #EmbraceEquity campaign theme is to get the world talking about Why equal opportunities aren't enough. People start from different places, so true inclusion and belonging require equitable action.



Hands-on Activities Workshops

Unemployment has become a very serious issue everywhere around the world. Mwema children Centre believes in nurturing talents that might be used as a substitute when one is not employed in formal sectors. Mwema has different skills developing activities such as;

- Tailoring (Sewing Machines)
- Arts and African Dance
- Drama, Comedy, Music
- Computer skills
- English language
- Agriculture
- Cooking and baking classes

All these activities are implemented to help a child to have options after completing their studies and when stack without employment.

1. Agriculture sessions.

With the support of Martin Sikukuu who is supervising the farming activities at Sumawe and one expert, children had opportunity to learn growing vegetables such chinese, Sukumawiki. as Amaranthus, spinac etc. Most of these classes were happening in the evening after school activities at Mwema, Ganako and Endoro primary school. In Saturdays, children were partcipating in the morning interchangebly with Secondary school children as their timetable differs. However, they all learned same thing that they can apply in their lives. The Sumawe farming activities involved COBET children who study at Mwema facilities, and this was an opportunity for them to learn and gain new agricultural insights.



At Mwema garden, children had opportunity to learn how to prepare a vegetable farm in a small area aiming at getting high yield. The agricultural class at Mwema was supported by local NGO that Mwema collaborate with. They provided drip irrigation for a small plot and techinical knowleget to the children and staff.



2. Cooking Class

Children from any age can help in the kitchen and learn culinary skills. Mwema had some views. However, this quarter, children participated in their kitchen routines this quarter. They work with cooks in supporting some of the activities in the kitchen as per their planned schedule. Next quarter that began in April, baking classes will begin as the Coking Oven is scheduled to be finished by mid-April 2023



3. Computer Class

Technology is a huge part of our lives, but it's changing quickly, so figuring out how to teach kids computer basics can be a challenge, but, at Mwema, we believe everything us possible with determination. Not much was done this quarter in children computer class as most of the computer needed some maintenances. However, Mwema is planning to introduce teaching classes using tech aid such as teaching tablets equipped with teaching resources for all children at Mwema.



4. Tailoring class

I think it's completely amazing when a parent spots the talent their kids have and takes the step to nurture that creativity right from a young age. Mwema is always helping children reach their goals even when others frowned at it. Mwema believes it is important to work on supporting children dreams right from a young age, as it could be the start of a great career. This quarter not much was done in sewing class due to most time being dedicated to agricultural session that needed a lot of time.
